Professionals working with teens and parents have a unique opportunity to address the growing concern of vaping, which is the most commonly used tobacco product by teens across the U.S., during Drug and Alcohol Facts week (March 17-23). According to the CDC, 2.13 million teens report using a vape or e-cigarette within the last month, with over a quarter of those using daily. These alarming facts highlight the need for education on the risks associated with vaping, which contains nicotine and other chemicals that can harm a teen's developing brain. Resources like The National Institute of Drug Abuse offer educational activities. videos. and Kahoot! guizzes that can be used so youth can learn what science has about drug taught us use and addiction.
